B. PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

a. History:

With an objective to promote Islamic learning and general education among the Muslim population in British India and with the sustained efforts of contemporary education minister of Bengal, A. K. Fazlul Haque, on December 9, 1924, Lord Lytton, the contemporary Governor of Bengal laid the foundation stone of *Islamia College* under the affiliation of University of Calcutta. The journey started under the leadership of The Principal, Mr. A. H. Harley, formerly, faculty of Oriental Languages, Edinburg University, UK.



Post independence, the college was renamed as *Central Calcutta College* and generously moved beyond religious barrier and was open for all male students. The leadership responsibility was rendered by Professor F. J. F. Pereira.

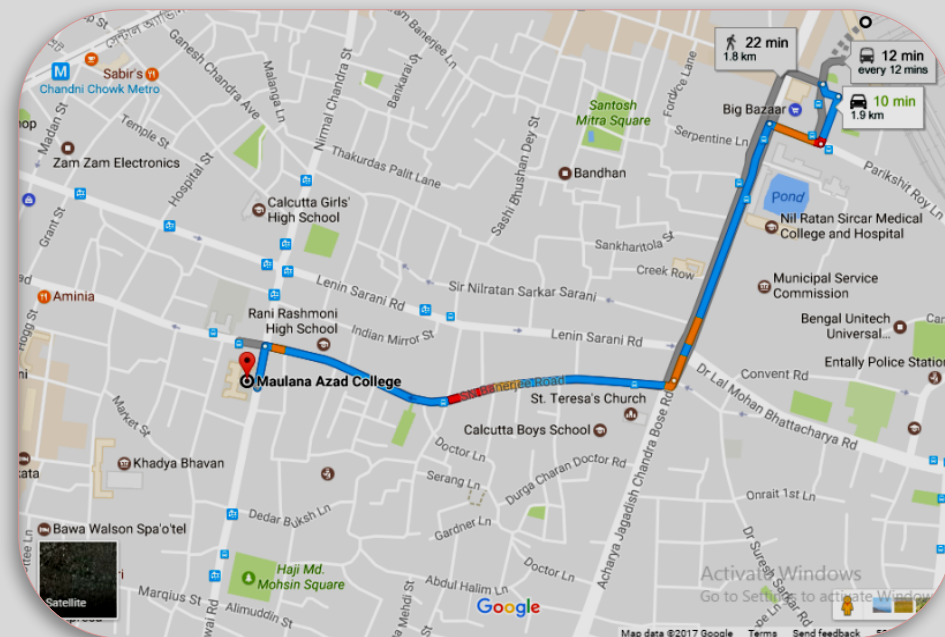
In 1960, the final baptism held as *Maulana Azad College* in the memory of the great national leader, erudite scholar and the first education minister of the independent India-Maulana Abul Kalam Azad. In 1990, the college was declared as co-educational institution. Gradually, the institution evolved as an academic place of harmonious co-existence amidst the plurality of gender, language, culture and religion.

Maulana Azad College has witnessed footsteps of eminent scholarly dedicated teachers like Bishnu Dey, Professor of English. The college has produced distinguished and notable nationalists, politicians, educationists, judges, ministers, novelists, IAS, IPS and WBCS officers. No surprise that Bangabandhu Sk. Mujibur Rahaman leads its alumni list.

b. Location:

The College is located in the heart of the Kolkata. The address is 8 Rafi Ahmed Kidwai Road, Kolkata-700013. It is easily accessible by bus, metro and rail. The distance from Dharamtala Bus stand is 800 meters, the distance from Esplanade Metro station is 750 meters, the distance from Sealdah Railway station is 1.9 kilometre, the distance from Howrah Railway Station is 4.6 kilometre, and the distance from Netaji Subhas Airport is 20 kilometre. The college is an attractive

choice for the students not only from the Kolkata and the districts of Howrah, Hooghly, North 24 Pgs and South 24 Pgs., but also from the other districts, states and countries.

✓ College

Campus: The College has a 5 acre campus in the heart of the city of Kolkata, which comprises of a Heritage Building and an Annex Building. The college has a traditional Char-Bagh (four gardens) as its facade and one of these serves as a well maintained 'medicinal plant' garden.

✓ **Principal's Office** is located in the Ground Floor of the main building of the college. The office is fully computerised with internet & LAN facilities.

✓ **Student's Section (Office)** is situated in the Ground Floor of Annexe Building of the college. This section monitors the collection and distribution of student's documents; admission, registration, examination and review system. Different fees of the students are also collected here. The office is fully computerised and with internet & LAN facilities.

✓ **Hostel Facility:** The College has a Boys' Hostel and an upcoming Girls' Hostel situated nearby.

✓ **Classrooms & Laboratories:** *Thirty Six Classrooms and Twenty two modern Laboratories* are there in the College, many of which are fully ICT enabled. Laboratories are spacious, up to date and all are well equipped with sophisticated instruments/equipments. Besides, there is a Central Instrumentation Facility, separate plant and animal tissue-culture laboratories

and a CPCSEA approved Animal House. In addition to that, seven well equipped Research Laboratories are there.

- ✓ **LAN & Wi-Fi connectivity:** Local Area Networking connections are operative in Office, Student section, Library, Staff-room, and in science departments. A new IQAC Room and Alumni Room have also been created with the similar facility. The College offers limited Wi-Fi connectivity for students and teachers.
- ✓ **Seminar Hall:** The College Hall (*Raza Washat Ali Memorial Hall*) having a sitting capacity of nearly 200, is used for national/international seminars or multi departmental seminars. The newest feather in the cap is a plush, air-conditioned ICT-enabled Seminar Hall.
- ✓ **Boys' and Girls' Common Rooms:** There are separate Boys' and Girls' Common Rooms.
- ✓ **Gymnasiums:** Separate Boys' and Girls' Gymnasiums are there in the college with all modern facilities.
- ✓ **Play Ground:** A playground-cum-staff quarter complex is there at 33, Gorachand Road, Kolkata.
- ✓ **Indoor/outdoor Game Facilities:** Provisions for outdoor games like Soccer, Cricket, Athletics and indoor games like Badminton, Table-Tennis, Carom, and Chess are there.
- ✓ **Canteen:** there is a canteen for students and staff in the college which offers palatable foods at affordable price.
- ✓ **CCTV** surveillance has been installed in the college campus and in the hostels.

d. Library:

The Library of Maulana Azad College possesses approximately 1,00,000 books, including a huge number of rare books, Manuscripts, Reference books like dictionaries, thesaurus, and encyclopaedias etc. The Rare Book Section of the Library mainly consists of books in Persian, Urdu, Arabic and English.



- ✓ The Central Library lends books to the Students who are its members. There are Departmental Seminar Libraries for the Honours and PG students of the various departments which also have lending services.
- ✓ Reading room facilities and reference services are also available in the Central Library.
- ✓ The Library provides internet facility as well.

- ✓ All sections of the library are computerized. It has a large reading room with air-conditioned facility.
- ✓ The library is connected with INFLIBNET and DELNET. Interested Library members may obtain the Password to browse the e- resources.
- ✓ Library membership card is issued to the interested students as per the Library Notice.

Library Rules and Regulations:

- Library books are issued strictly against the Library card.
- Library books and Library Cards must be returned to the Library at the end of each session of 1st Year, 2nd year and 3rd year.
- Personal belongings (books, bags etc.) are not allowed inside the library, except in the Reading Room.
- Mobile phone should be kept on silent mode.
- Library membership card is not transferable.
- Books can be re-issued after 15 days for a further period of 15 days
- Books issued from the library must be returned within 30 days.
- Rare books, reference books, thesaurus, dictionaries, encyclopaedias etc. are not lent out.
- Any breach of the library rules or discipline will result in forfeiture of the Library Membership card.

i. General Information:

- ✓ Only those Students who have passed Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent examination in 2018 (or 2017) from any recognized Board are eligible to apply. Students coming from (10+2) Boards of other states both in India and abroad are also eligible to apply.
- ✓ Students should have to acquire qualifying marks in English (having full marks at least 100) irrespective of what the subjects they are applying for.
- ✓ Candidates who passed from the West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education & Training are not eligible to apply.

ii. Admission Rules:

- Admission to the college is strictly granted on the understanding that the student undertakes to conform to the rules of the college as well as the norms laid down by the University of Calcutta in all respects.
- A candidate may apply for more than one Honours / General subjects but separate applications must be submitted for each subject.
- SC/ST/ OBC-A/ OBC-B candidates, only from West Bengal, are eligible for reservation benefits.
- Seats in each subject are reserved for Physically Challenged candidates as per Government norms.
- Admission to any course of the college is provisional and is subject to final approval of the University of Calcutta.
- Anti-ragging declaration as per UGC norm is mandatory at the time of admission.
- Admission will be made strictly on the basis of merit.

iii. Admission Procedure:

- ✓ Admission process is conducted online through the college website: www.maulanaazadcollege.in
- ✓ Beware of any tout or other agents. For any information regarding admission contact College Office/ Admission Committee only.
- ✓ The procedure of admission to the three-year degree course starts after publication of the result of Higher Secondary Examination conducted by the West Bengal Council for Higher Secondary Education. Candidates are advised to visit the college website immediately after publication of the aforesaid result.

They are also advised to check the website regularly for important notifications and updates.

- ✓ A separate application must be submitted online for each Honours/ General subject applied.
- ✓ Application Fees is Rs. 100.00 for each subject applied for. Any sort of cash for application should be deposited at any branch of the Indian Bank only. Interference of any third party is not allowed.
- ✓ For Eligibility for application in different subjects and number of subject wise seats: See the College Website (www.maulanaazadcollege.in) / College Notice Board / College Prospectus.
- ✓ Provisional Merit List will be published in the College Website as well as in the College Notice Board.
- ✓ For any discrepancy/clarification in Merit List, candidates are advised to directly contact the convener of the Admission Committee and accordingly if required Corrigendum Merit List may be published immediately.
- ✓ Subject wise Counselling will be held online strictly as per Merit List and the detailed procedure will be available in the College Website.
- ✓ Candidates are required to bring the followings on the day of counselling for document verification: the print out of the filled out Application (with recent Photograph (self attested) affixed in the space specified), the Money Receipt, print out of the Anti-Ragging Declaration done online and the relevant original Certificates/ Testimonials. Provisional Admission is only possible after satisfactory verification of the documents.
- ✓ If seats remain vacant after the 1st Counselling, candidates with ranks immediately next to the rank of the last admitted candidate in each subject will be called for the 2nd phase of Counselling and provisional admission. Details will be notified in College Website /College Notice Board after the completion of the 1st Counselling.

A short history on Baker Govt. hostel (1910-2018)



To find out a proper solution to the students problem in terms of residence, the Muslim leaders of Calcutta again assembled at the Historic Town Hall in 1910 and unanimously adopted a resolution that they should initiate the proposal of constructing a hostel building.

Baker Govt. Hostel

Khwaja Sallimullah, the Nawab of Dacca, echoing the sentiments of Muslim donated a generous amount of Rs 30,000 for the construction of hostel building. Following the noble footsteps of Nawab Sahib, some of the elite present in the meeting, also contributed for the same. The govt. when approached agreed to bear the half of the expenditure and allocated necessary fund for the construction of the building.

Thus in 1910 a fascinated and storied building consisting of rooms with lush green lawn into existence. This hostel building was named after Edward Norman Baker, Lieutenant Governor of Bengal. After the establishment of the Islamiah College (now Maulana Azad College) in the privilege of residence extended to the students of Islamiah College coming the mufussil and adjoining



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During the long span of 108 from 1910 to 2018, the hostel has contributed in molding the shape of nation in one way or other. This century old hostel is proud to have provided accommodation to innumerable students who have spread far and wide and contributed richly to all walks of life. Among them the illustrious names of *Bangabandhu Sk. Mujibur Rahman*, father of the nation of Bangladesh.

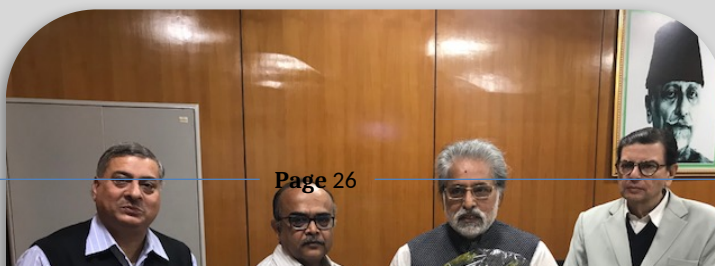

*Such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or the date of admission, whichever is later.

The history of the department of English dates back to 1926 - the year of inception of the college. It is with immense pride that we recall the presence of luminaries in the departmental faculty, like the legendary teacher of English, Prof. Taraknath Sen, the renowned poet Prof. Bishnu Dey, the lexicographer Prof. Gouri Ghosh, the eminent teacher Prof. Kalidas Bose, among others. This heritage is what we, the present generation of teachers in the department, are trying to live up to and further enrich.

**Celebration of Rabindra Jayanti by Dept. of English**

Exposing students to the aesthetics of English literature and English Language was what the department primarily intended. This tradition has been continued as teachers try to instill in students the skills required for a proper appreciation of literature in students. This emphasis on developing a critical insight is carried out with a simultaneous honing of their language skills. We help to bring out the latent creative abilities of the students through encouragement and guidance. We believe in fostering literary sensibilities and creative imagination and feel that is very important in cultivating a holistic approach to life. The department has an extensive collection of over 200 books in its seminar library; both undergraduate and postgraduate students borrow books from there.

The Post Graduate course in English was introduced in the year 2009-10 under the University of Calcutta. Semester system is being followed and sixteen courses are being offered. Continuous evaluation, both internal and external, is undertaken. Students are required to write term papers and dissertations on topics of their special interests. Guest teachers from the University of Calcutta and other Universities are extending their co-operation in this regard.

What has given an added dimension to the department is its close association with the eminent poet professor Jayanta Mahapatra. The department has successfully completed the translation of his autobiography.

Seminars and talks are regularly arranged by the department, providing students with an extensive exposure to the academic world. Post Graduate Department of Urdu

How it grew:

The department of Urdu was established at the inception of the College. In the beginning, Urdu, Persian and Arabic were under a single department. In July 1967, the Urdu department was separated from the others. The renowned poet, Prof. Raza Ali Wahshat, honoured by the British Government as Khan Bahadur, was the first teacher of this department.

He served the department from 1926 to 1937, and in that period the department progressed a lot. Following his path, this department earned fame as the best centre of Urdu language in eastern India. Prof. Abbas Ali

Khan Bekhud, Prof. Shah Maqbool Ahmed, Prof. Javeed Nehal, Prof. Ezaz Afzal and Prof. Abu Nasr Ghazali were renowned teachers of the department. The department always tries to expose the students to the aesthetics of Urdu Literature and Language. The Department of Urdu and the associated teachers believe in fostering literary sensibilities among the students.

The Post Graduate Course in Urdu was introduced in 2009-2010 with semester system under the University of Calcutta. The students of Urdu are required to write term papers and projects on their special interest areas.

Guest teachers from different universities and colleges have been extending their helping hands. The department seeks their advice and guidance in its functioning. Prof. Qaiser Shameem, Prof. Shamim Anwar, Prof. S. M. Shabber, renowned short story writer, Shahira Khatoon, and Dr. Hasin Ahmed Zahedi are our guest teachers and advisors. 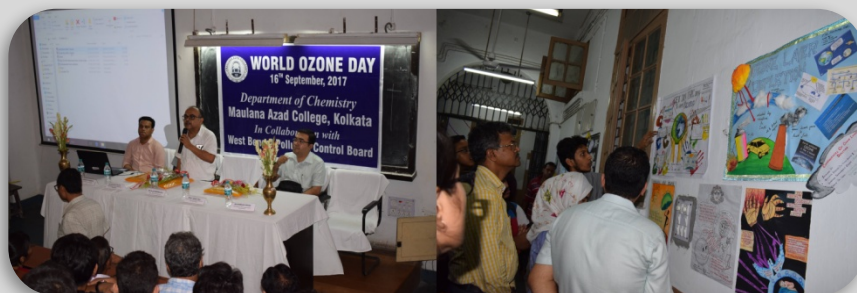
